Since its inception, the We-Care program has achieved significant milestones:

- Training of Trainers (TOT) sessions were provided both at Federal and Regional level for experts from government and Civil Society Organizations to enhance their knowledge on Unpaid Care and Domestic Work'
 - A policy brief was made to make sure the care economy aspect is addressed in the new Gender policy which is under revision.
 - In collaboration with the Ethiopian Media Women's Association (EMWA) awareness creation training for media professionals from diverse regions was provided

 A rapid assessment on the feasibility and models of child care centers in the private sector was made, to support effective planning & intervention efforts, & use the finding as a benchmark to measure progress towards women's empowerment & reduction of care burdens.
